What is Substance Use Disorder?

According to the National Institute of Mental health, SUD is "is a mental disorder that affects a person's brain and behavior, leading to a person's inability to control their use of substances such as legal or illegal drugs, alcohol, or medications" (2021).

130 opioid deaths everyday


1 out of 3 families are affected by SUD

10% people that have SUD receive treatment



Contributing Factors

An absence of education on substance use disorders necessary for employers to be of assistance to their employees

Possible scheduling conflicts for treatment

Lack of transportation

Lack of childcare

Mental health aspects inside and outside of work

Hustle culture

Stress

Stigma

In 2020, about 12% of people who felt they needed substance use treatment but did not receive it in the past year said they did not seek treatment because they feared attracting negative attitudes from their communities (National Institute on Drug Abuse, n.d.).

Word Choice

"Clinicians rated a person described as a "substance abuser" as more worthy of blame and punishment than someone described as "having a substance use disorder" (National Institute on Drug Abuse, n.d.).
