As a public health agency, DHD10 does not provide treatment services. Most of their work across their 10 counties under the substance use umbrella is prevention. Their connection with CMREN lies within the area of harm reduction. They do activities such as sharps takeback and safe use kits for those using IV drugs. Sharps takeback is where individuals can stop in their office during normal business hours and return sharps in an appropriate container, and receive a new sharps container if needed. Their safe use kits is a new initiative that began January 1st, where individuals can get a safe use kit during all normal business hours. Kits contain items that can reduce the negative effects associated with drug use including syringes, alcohol swabs, sterile water, cookers, cottons, tourniquets, fentanyl test strips, and condoms. Although they are not currently doing direct service for naloxone access, they are communicating with CMREN to support this work in whatever way they can. Their agency is purchasing naloxone vending boxes throughout their 10 counties, and they are a willing partner to help purchase more as needed.
