Backpack Drive:

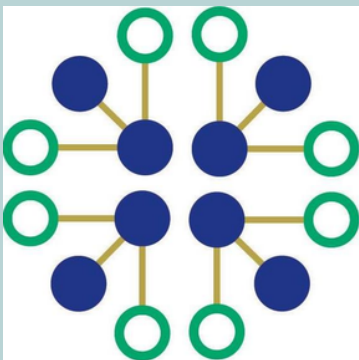
CMREN will be picking up all donation boxes from the backpack drive on Thursday, March 2nd.

Community Mental Health for Central Michigan

Community Mental Health for Central Michigan (CMHCM) is a six-county wide CMH system that serves Mecosta, Osceola, Clare, Isabella, Gladwin, and Midland counties. CMHCM strives to provide comprehensive mental health services, often working with those with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders. They offer therapy, case management, psychiatric care, and nursing services. They have additional programs for families and children, and all staff are trained in evidence-based practices which allow for an integrated approach to recovery.

Their staff serve on several community-wide committees and forums in hopes of increasing support and resources within Mecosta and Osceola counties for those struggling with co-occurring disorders. CMHCM gives a special shoutout to Ms. Erin Clark, one of CMHCM's case managers in Mecosta County for taking on the role of President at Families Against Narcotics (FAN). She works with a team (including CMREN's project director, Dr. Gail Bullard) to increase support for families in the area.
